Relationship explanation: Assessment of "high opportunities for advancement" is partly a result of labor market opportunities assessment

Relationship explanation: Expectation of improvement is linked with high opportunities of advancement. The more opportunities - the bigger expectations of improvement

Relationship explanation: Satisfaction with job security might positively affect assessment of subjective high opportunities for advancement

Relationship explanation: Job satisfaction is usually positively affected by high opportunities for advancement

Potential misinterpretation: The indicator measures subjective assessment of opportunities, but does not measure the assessment of the job market

Related Indicator: [Subjective Assessment of Labour Market Opportunities](#) [7]

Potential misinterpretation: Opportunities for advancement are usually correlated with the perception of job security, which is not measured by the indicator.

Related Indicator: [Satisfied with Job Security](#) [9]

Potential misinterpretation: Opportunities of advancement might affect job satisfaction, which is not measured by the indicator

Related Indicator: [Job satisfaction \(under development in SILC 2013\)](#) [10]
